**God cares for the physical, mental, social and spiritual wellbeing of everyone, whether or not they come to church.**

A recent survey of parish nurses gives a glimpse of their amazing work. 95% of them work with older people, 73% support those with mental health problems and 63% help those living with a disability. That’s in addition to their work with children, young people, ethnic minorities, those with addictive behaviours, asylum seekers and sex workers .

**What can a Parish Nurse do?**

Home visits, clinics in church premises, carer support groups, exercise groups, health education and screening, advice for good nutrition, and health advocacy of various kinds are the main interventions. To help them in this work they recruit, train and coordinate a volunteer team. They liaise with GP surgeries, follow up people who come home from hospital, refer to other voluntary agencies, and will pray with people if they want that. But the thing that parish nurses value most is the ability to spend time with people , actively listening to their concerns and offering spiritual care.
